1. Waterline Project

Highway Occupancy Permit \$220 application fee.

PWSID has been assigned. This will allow the Borough to apply for federal funding.

EADS wants to submit Pennvest by the end of July. This application will be reviewed in October. Pennvest will award money after meeting with EADS at later date. After money is awarded bids will be accepted. Project will be awarded and project is slated to start in the Spring of 2027.
